"Any legal entity (such as an enterprise, a research institution or a public institution) in or outside Denmark, directly involved in the project activities, is eligible to apply or participate and receive funding from Innovation Fund Denmark." (IFD Guidelines)



GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

"DFF has as its objective to advance and strengthen Danish research, understood in a broad sense. Therefore, **DFF has no requirements as to applicants' citizenship, the location of research institutions or the specific geographic location where the research activities in question will be carried out**. In every case, DFF will assess an application based on whether the project in question benefits Danish research. (DFF Guidelines)

WHAT EXPENSES DOES DFF GENERALLY SUPPORT?

- Salaries for personnel (VIP and TAP)
- Equipment (exceeding DKK 500,000 per item, excluding overhead/administrative expenses)
- Operating expenses (including equipment up to DKK 500,000 per item)
- Overhead




