- Launch of a multi-disciplinary Master Programme in African Studies at the University of Sousse in September 2017
- Transgress limits of academic disciplines and strengthen expertise and skills by applying them to the study of African societies and cultures
- Internationalization in terms of teaching staff exchange, studies abroad, and research co-operations
- Facilitating contacts and collaborations with diplomatic institutions and various national and international organisations of development cooperation
- Ensure practical relevance of African Studies in Sousse and future job perspectives both in practice and academics

Project

Due to the close cultural and historical links between the Maghreb and Africa south of the Sahara and in the light of recent, dynamic and impactful developments on many levels in Africa, the Faculty of Letters and Human Sciences of the University of Sousse in Tunisia intends to develop a Master programme in African Studies to be launched in September 2017. Unique in Tunisia, it will be based on the experience in multi-disciplinary African Studies gained over decades at the University of Bayreuth and the innovative and recently launched BA programme in Anthropology at the University of Sousse. The Master programme will be open to all facets of African studies and will orient towards developmental issues in African contexts

Scholars, teaching staff, and students with different disciplinary backgrounds participate in the activities throughout the project process. Moreover, the project aims at linking universities, research institutions, NGOs, diplomatic institutions and further actors concerned with Africa.
